Wednesday, January 13, 2021

State Update

Governor Murphy announced a major expansion of the state's vaccination program. Beginning today, eligible people who live, work or study in New Jersey who are 65 and older as well as those ages 16 to 64 who have certain medical conditions can receive the Coronavirus vaccine. People are asked to register on the state's website and then make an appointment at one of the 123 approved sites around the state. Tuesday, January 5, 2021

State Update

The state has provided informative documents regarding the COVID-19 vaccinations which are now posted on the Randolph Township website (randolphnj.org). These include a letter from the NJ Department of Health explaining vaccine Phase 1A, vaccine facts, and vaccine locations. Saturday, January 2, 2021

County Update

Morris County's at-home testing program is being phased out for all but homebound, symptomatic residents. Instead, the focus will be on having residents use the walk-up testing center at County College of Morris (CCM). Walk up testing requires individuals to [preregister for a test](#) through the Morris County COVID-19 website. Individuals who are symptomatic and unable to leave their home will still be able to order no-cost, at-home tests through the [Morris County COVID-19 website](#), but the only at-home test available will be a federally-supported nasal test known as Pixel, which is provided by Lab Corp.

Wednesday, December 30, 2020

State Update

Governor Murphy announced that the state now has a central online location for official COVID-19 vaccine-related information, with a landing page for the Vaccine Registration portal in the near future. Visit covid19.nj.gov/vaccine, for more information.

Monday, December 14, 2020

County Update

Morris County's Board of Freeholders announced the launch of a no-cost, COVID-19 testing station for Morris County residents and people who work in Morris County inside the Student Center at the County College of Morris (CCM). The tests will be made available by appointment only, and appointments are now being accepted for testing on Monday, Dec. 14, and Saturday, Dec. 19.

After next week, appointments for the testing at CCM will be scheduled for Mondays, Wednesdays and Saturdays. No one will be permitted to walk into the facility without an appointment, and appointments must be scheduled on-line through the [Morris County COVID-19 Information website](#). Proof of residency or proof of employment within Morris County will be required upon arrival at the Student Center for the appointment.

Friday, December 11, 2020

County Update

Morris County's Board of Freeholders today announced the launch of a no-cost, COVID-19 testing station for Morris County residents and people who work in Morris County inside the Student Center at the County College of Morris (CCM). The tests will be made available by appointment only; appointments are being accepted now for testing on Monday, Dec. 14 and Saturday, Dec. 19. After next week, appointments for the testing at CCM will be scheduled for Mondays, Wednesdays and Saturdays. No one will be permitted to walk into the facility without an appointment; appointments must be scheduled on-line through the [Morris County COVID-19 Information website](#).

Proof of residency or proof of employment within Morris County will be required upon arrival at the Student Center for the appointment. Individuals will be limited to two, no-cost tests per month whether they receive the tests at the CCM facility or through the at-home testing program currently available to Morris County residents and workers through the county's COVID-19 information website. Wednesday, December 9, 2020

State Update

The NJEDA has announced that the deadline for companies to receive discounts on purchases of personal protective equipment (PPE) through the [New Jersey Small and Micro Business PPE Access Program](#) has been extended by one week to Thursday, December 17, 2020. The decision to extend the deadline was made in response to the significant demand for support through the PPE Access Program. To date more than 7,500 business and organizations have been approved for more than \$6.4 million in discounts through the program. More information is available at <https://ppe.covid19.nj.gov>.

Monday, November 30, 2020

State Update

Governor Murphy signed [Executive Order No. 204](#), prohibiting indoor practices and competitions for organized, group, and/or competitive sports defined as “Low Risk”, “Medium Risk”, and “High Risk” by DOH’s “Guidance for Sports Activities”. The order also limits the number of individuals at outdoor gatherings to 25 persons or fewer. An outdoor gathering that is a religious service, wedding ceremony, funeral, or memorial service is not required to comply with the numerical limit on persons. Local Update

Monday, November 23, 2020

State Update

The New Jersey Economic Development Authority (NJEDA) announced that it will increase the discounts available on purchases of personal protective equipment made through the NJ Small and Micro Business PPE Access Program to nearly 70 percent, effective Tuesday, November 24, 2020. The NJEDA will also double the per-business cap on discount vouchers. These discounts will be available to New Jersey businesses and nonprofits with 100 or fewer employees until December 10, 2020. Monday, November 16, 2020

State Update

Governor Phil Murphy signed [Executive Order No. 196](#), lowering the indoor and outdoor gathering limits. Effective Tuesday, November 17 at 6:00 a.m., the indoor gathering limit will decrease from 25 to 10 people. The outdoor gathering limit will decrease from 500 people to 150 people, effective Monday, November 23 at 6:00 a.m.

Thursday, November 12, 2020

State Update

Governor Phil Murphy signed [Executive Order No. 195](#), which permits municipalities and counties to impose additional restrictions on the hours of operation of non-essential retail businesses, food and beverage establishments, and recreation and entertainment businesses after 8:00 p.m. The Order prohibits municipalities and counties from imposing restrictions that prevent dining establishments from arranging for the pickup or delivery of goods or otherwise limiting their scope of operations. The Order will take effect immediately.

Tuesday, November 10, 2020

State Update

Governor Phil Murphy signed [Executive Order No. 194](https://nj.gov/infobank/eo/056murphy/pdf/EO-194.pdf), which includes new COVID-19 mitigation measures. The measures include restrictions on seating and hours for restaurants, bars, clubs, and lounges, and prohibition of interstate indoor K-12 and youth sports. The measures will take effect on Thursday, November 12 at 5:00 a.m. <https://nj.gov/infobank/eo/056murphy/pdf/EO-194.pdf>

Wednesday, October 28, 2020

State Update

Governor Phil Murphy signed [Executive Order No. 192](#), providing mandatory health and safety standards to protect all New Jersey's workers at work during the pandemic. The executive order will require both private and public sector employers to follow health and safety protocols that will serve to protect their in-person workforces. The Order mandates that as of 6:00 a.m. on November 5th, all employers, at minimum, require individuals at the worksite to maintain at least six feet of distance from others to the maximum extent possible and require employees and visitors to wear masks when entering the worksite, subject to certain limited exceptions. The Department of Labor and Workforce Development (NJDOLE) will support the Department of Health's efforts to address worker complaints from their employers.

Friday, October 9, 2020

County Update

Morris County and its 39 towns will share \$8,415,816 in federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act funding out of \$60 Million released by Governor Phil Murphy for severely impacted county and local governments not qualified to receive direct federal aid. Morris County will receive \$2.3 million while \$6.1 million is being shared among the municipalities. The funding is intended to help towns deal with the unexpected costs caused by the pandemic, including increased costs in health benefits, health and human services, public safety, overtime, equipment and supply expenditures. Wednesday, October 7, 2020

State Update

The New Jersey Economic Development Authority (NJEDA) announced the launch of the Business Consulting for COVID-19 Recovery Program, a free consulting program to help small businesses address the challenges they are facing as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic and help them prepare for a strong long-term recovery. Participating businesses will receive advice and assistance in securing grants and loans, adapting their business models to current needs, crafting long-term business strategies, evaluating their financial health, and improving accounting and bookkeeping systems, among other services and lessons that can help them build a stronger, more sustainable business. The program's pilot phase is currently eligible to businesses with five or fewer employees that maintain a physical storefront or office space in one of New Jersey's 169 [Opportunity Zones](#). Friday, October 2, 2020

State Update

Governor Murphy and New York Governor Andrew Cuomo announced the launch of COVID-19 exposure notification mobile apps in their respective states that will serve as a tool to supplement contact tracing efforts. The free mobile apps, COVID Alert NJ and COVID Alert NY, are available to anyone 18 or older who lives, works, or attends college in New Jersey or New York, and are available for download from the Google Play Store or Apple App Store.

The apps use Exposure Notification System Technology, developed by Google and Apple, to strengthen contact tracing programs in New Jersey and New York. The COVID Alert apps notify users if they have been in close contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19. For more information about the COVID Alert NJ app, visit www.nj.gov.

Tuesday, September 1, 2020

State Update

Governor Murphy signed [Executive Order No.183](#) permitting food and beverage establishments to offer in-person service at indoor areas provided they follow NJ Department of Health guidelines. **The order takes effect at 6:00 a.m. on Friday, September 4, 2020.** For a copy of the Department of Health Executive Directive click [here](#). Governor Murphy signed [Executive Order No.181](#), permitting gyms and health clubs to reopen their indoor premises to the public on Tuesday, September 1 at 6:00 a.m., provided that they comply with the health and safety standards issued by the New Jersey Department of Health (NJDOH).

Wednesday, August 12, 2020

State Update

Governor Murphy announced the first phase of the New Jersey Small and Micro Business PPE Access Program, designed to ensure that the state's small businesses and non-profits have access to the fairly priced personal protective equipment (PPE) necessary to facilitate safe working conditions during the COVID-19 Pandemic. The phase was approved by the New Jersey Economic Development Authority Board on August 11, 2020, advancing this initial step of a \$15 million initiative to address the ongoing demand for PPE.

The program's first phase will include the launch of a new website that provides micro and small businesses with the information needed to make more accessible and improved PPE sourcing decisions. Applications for online retailers to participate in the program are expected to launch soon. More information can be found on the State's COVID19.nj.gov website. Tuesday, August 11, 2020

Federal Update

The New Jersey Economic Development Authority announced that it has started accepting applications for its expanded Micro Business Loan Program to support small businesses facing challenges as a result of COVID-19. Applications will be accepted on a rolling basis and can be found at www.njeda.com.

State Update

The New Jersey Economic Development Authority (NJEDA) announced that its Board has approved the use of \$15.3 million in Coronavirus, Aid, Relief and Emergency Security (CARES) Act funding to provide grants through the Authority's Small Business Emergency Assistance Grant Program to businesses located in 12 counties that did not receive direct allocations of CARES Act funding from the federal government. The funds will be added to the more than \$100 million the NJEDA is currently administering to support COVID-19-impacted businesses. The additional \$15.3 million approved for use today will go toward fulfilling eligible Phase 2 grant applications from businesses located in the 12 New Jersey counties that did not receive direct CARES Act funding allocations from the federal government: Atlantic, Burlington, Cape May, Cumberland, Gloucester, Hunterdon, Mercer, Morris, Salem, Somerset, Sussex, and Warren, to learn more visit www.njeda.com.

Friday, August 7, 2020

State Update

The New Jersey Department of Health unveiled an online dashboard designed to highlight contact tracing efforts being conducted throughout the state. The Contact Tracing Dashboard operates as an addition to the New Jersey COVID-19 Dashboard which encompasses information such as COVID-19 cases and trends, case and mortality summaries, and hospital discharges. The new dashboard will present information about the rate of successful contact interviews, the number of contacts notified, the effectiveness of the tracing, etc.; to learn more visit, www.nj.gov.

Tuesday, August 3, 2020

State Update

Governor Phil Murphy announced the decrease of the indoor gathering capacity limit in response to the increase of COVID-19 cases in New Jersey. Indoor gatherings are now limited to 25 percent of a room's capacity, but regardless of the room's capacity, the maximum limit shall be 25 persons, down from 100 persons. For purposes of determining this limit, any private residence or residential unit shall be treated as a single room. However, today's change will not be applicable to the following events: weddings, funerals, memorial services, religious services or celebrations, and political activities. These events may continue under the previous rules that limited these events to 25 percent of a room's capacity, but with a limit of 100 persons, to learn more visit www.nj.gov.

Friday, July 17, 2020

State Update

Governor Murphy signed [Executive Order No. 166](#), which establishes the Governor’s Disaster Recovery Office (GDRO) and COVID-19 Compliance Task Force. The GDRO will assume the responsibilities of the Governor's Office of Recovery & Rebuilding, which will no longer exist. The GDRO will be responsible for the following activities, among others:

- Coordinating the work of “COVID-19 Accountability Officers,” as described in the order, to ensure cross-agency collaboration, compliance, and transparency
- Developing a transparency website within ninety (90) days of the date of this order to track the State’s eligible and planned uses of any funds disbursed by the federal or State government to help New Jersey residents, businesses, non-profit organizations, government agencies, and other entities respond to or recover from the COVID-19 pandemic
- Coordinating and consulting with all relevant stakeholders regarding the disbursement of COVID-19 Recovery Funds and the administration of COVID-19 Recovery Programs
- Publishing an annual report summarizing the State’s use of federal funds in response to COVID-19. For information about Executive Order No. 166, visit www.nj.gov.

Thursday, July 16, 2020

State Update

Representative Mikie Sherrill launched a second survey for small businesses in the 11th District of New Jersey to collect feedback on the COVID-19 and reopening challenges they are continuing to face. Phil Murphy signed [Executive Order No.163](#) which will lift the 50 percent ridership capacity on NJ Transit private-carrier buses, trains, light rail vehicles, and Access Link vehicles starting on Wednesday, July 15, at 8 p.m. Additionally Governor Murphy signed Executive Order 163 requiring individuals to wear masks in outdoor public spaces when they cannot social distance, for more information about these orders visit www.nj.gov/infobank.

Monday, July 6, 2020

Federal Update

The U.S. Small Business Administration, in consultation with the Treasury Department, announced it was releasing detailed loan-level data regarding the loans made under the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP). This disclosure covers each of the 4.9 million PPP loans that have been made. The data release also includes overall statistics regarding dollars lent per state, loan amounts, top lenders, and distribution by industry.

The data provides information regarding the sizes of participating lenders, community development financial institutions, minority depository institutions, Farm Credit System institutions, fin techs and other nonbanks, and other types of lenders. It further contains data showing the reach of the program in underserved communities, rural communities, historically underutilized business zones (HUB Zones), and participation by religious, grant making, civil, professional, and other similar organizations. State Update

Governor Murphy issued [Executive Order No. 161](#), which allows for an increase in the capacity of outdoor gathering restrictions to 500 people, effective 6:00 a.m. on Friday, July 3. Outdoor religious services and political activities continue to have no numerical limits. All indoor gatherings continue to be limited to 25 percent capacity of the rooms in which they will take place, with a maximum of 100 persons. Also on Thursday, July 2 Governor Murphy issued [Executive Order No. 162](#), extending the public health emergency in New Jersey for an additional 30 days.

Monday, June 29, 2020

State Update

Governor Murphy announced that plans to allow indoor dining will no longer resume on Thursday, July 2. The state had planned to loosen dining restrictions this week; however after a trend of COVID-19 case spikes in other states driven by, in part, the return of indoor dining, the decision to postpone indoor dining indefinitely was made, for more information visit www.nj.gov.

Friday, June 26, 2020

State Update

Governor Murphy issued [Executive Order No. 157](#) allowing for indoor dining to resume at 25% capacity on July 2. Executive Order No. 157 also includes guidelines for recreational and entertainment businesses to reopen on July 2 at 25% capacity. Gyms and fitness centers, movie theaters, performing arts centers, concert venues, and indoor amusement and water parks must remain closed until further notice, except that gyms and fitness centers may offer individualized indoor instruction by appointment only.

Friday, June 26, 2020

County Update

The Morris County COVID-19 testing center at CCM closed today. The center, which was operated in coordination with Atlantic Health Systems, closed because many other test providers are now available, including numerous urgent care facilities and pharmacies across the county that are now offering nasal swab and saliva tests. In the nearly three months of operation, the CCM site provided nasal swab tests to some 8,000 residents. State Update

The NJ Department of Community Affairs (DCA) announced the launch of the COVID-19 Emergency Rental Assistance Program (CVERAP) which will provide temporary rental assistance to selected low and moderate income households who have experienced unemployment or reduced income due to the pandemic. Saturday, June 13, 2020

State Update

Governor Murphy issued [Executive Order No. 154](#) permitting personal care services to open effective 6:00 a.m. on Monday, June 22 provided that the facility complies with standards issued by the NJ Division of Consumer Affairs and NJ Department of Health. Additionally, [Administrative Order No. 2020-15](#) was issued concerning the reopening of libraries under certain circumstance. This order also provides additional guidance on schools, real estate open houses, essential retail businesses, car washes, yard sales, special events and private tutoring facilities.

Thursday, June 11, 2020

State Update

Governor Murphy's Administration, in conjunction with Rutgers University's Heldrich Center for Workforce Development, released the results of an online survey conducted earlier this month. The survey drew responses from nearly 4,000 businesses and non-profits across New Jersey. Results of the survey demonstrate, overwhelmingly, that while the business and non-profit community is eager to get back to work, owners understand and take seriously the public health risks posed by COVID-19 and the responsibility to provide a safe experience for employees and customers. The survey found that a majority of small business owners (51%) cited consumer confidence as the most pressing issue, while 13% cited access to personal protective equipment as their biggest concern, for further information about the survey findings visit www.nj.gov.

Wednesday, June 10, 2020

State Update

Governor Murphy issued two new Executive Orders, including the lifting of a statewide stay-at-home directive and expanding limits on the number of people allowed at indoor and outdoor gatherings. In addition, all outdoor recreation and entertainment businesses can reopen except for amusement parks, water parks, and arcades. The Governor stated that the latter group of businesses brings in a high concentration of people into high touch areas, so they are presently not safe; he promised to consider their reopening in the future. The Governor asked that residents continue to be responsible and safe by wearing face coverings and practicing social distancing.

Tuesday, June 9, 2020

State Update

At 9:00 a.m. this morning applications for Phase 2 of the New Jersey Economic Development Authority's Small Business Emergency Assistance Grant Program became available. The new round of applications will mark the second phase of the NJEDA Small Business Emergency Assistance Grant Program which previously provided more than \$8 million in grants to nearly 2,500 businesses across New Jersey's 21 counties during Phase 1. Phase 2 of the application program includes eligibility changes related to NAICS codes, employee caps, home-based businesses and non-profit organizations, applicants interested in learning about their eligibility or applying for the program can visit faq.business.nj.gov. Local Update

The Morris County Covid-19 drive-through test center at the County College of Morris in Randolph will now be open to all Morris County and Sussex County residents who want a nasal swab test, without a prescription and whether or not they are experiencing COVID-19 symptoms. All first responders and health care workers, who work in Morris and Sussex County, will also be offered priority testing without a prescription or symptoms, regardless of their county of residence. State Update

The New Jersey Economic Development Authority (NJEDA) announced that applications for the expanded Small Business Emergency Assistance Grant Program will be available at 9:00 a.m. on June 9, 2020 in both English and Spanish. Governor Murphy's previously outlined multi-stage reopening plan will progress into Stage Two, starting Monday, June 15. Guided by strict protocols from the New Jersey Department of Health, as well as input from the Governor's Restart and Recovery Commission and complementary Advisory Councils, Stage Two will include outdoor dining for restaurants, and limited in-person non-essential retail. Beginning on June 22, barbershops and salons will be able to reopen. All of these activities will be allowed under strict health and safety guidelines that will be issued in the coming days.
